# The following communication from the office of Dr. Marisa D'Angeli at Washington Department of Health:

As healthcare professionals, we have a responsibility to provide quality care for every patient in every healthcare encounter. Infection prevention—including standard and risk-based precautions; hand hygiene; respiratory hygiene; injection safety; environmental cleaning; and reprocessing of reusable medical equipment—require constant vigilance. Recent large infection prevention lapses show that infection prevention expertise, adherence to policies and procedures, and job- or task-specific infection prevention training and assessment of competency on a regular basis are essential for protecting patients and staff from avoidable harm.
