Project Timeline



Safe visiting practices

Visitors who have a positive COVID test, symptoms of COVID, or currently meet the criteria for quarantine should not enter the facility

Hand hygiene (use of alcohol-based hand rub is preferred)

Face covering or mask (covering mouth and nose) and physical distancing at least six feet between people, in accordance with CDC guidance

Cleaning and disinfecting high frequency touched surfaces in the facility often, and designated visitation areas after each visit

Appropriate use of Personal Protective Equipment (PPE)
