



## Potential Very Warm Temperatures Next Week

There is potential for a period of very warm weather across Western Washington next week, and we want to provide a brief overview of the forecast. In order to be brief, there are little to no weather-related impacts expected through Sunday (7/24), with temperatures beginning to warm on Monday (7/25).

### KEY POINTS

- Temperatures will warm next week for potential hot conditions, particularly Tuesday-Thursday
- Uncertainty in exact temperatures, as well as the duration of heat
- Heat Risk concerns are possible for the population, especially those sensitive to heat as well as those without effective cooling or hydration

### WEATHER RISK OUTLOOK

Risk levels incorporate potential impacts from weather hazards and likelihood of occurrence.

**Impacts:**

Heat-related illnesses, especially for those who are sensitive to heat, especially those without effective cooling and/or adequate hydration. Increase in water-related accidents.

At this time, the warmest days appear to be Tuesday through Thursday. However, warm temperatures look to continue late next week as well.
